Bricolage/Craft

Ballons de dinosaures/Dinosaur Balloons

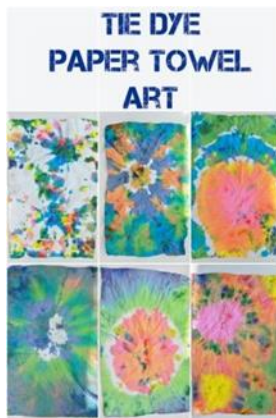
Materials: balloons, construction paper, markers, tape

Instructions:

First, blow up several balloons and different colors. Then cut out shapes for the head, legs, and tail. You can pre-draw the shapes or find templates online to trace. Then use clear tape to attach the construction paper to the balloon. Make sure the part of the balloon you tie is the head of the dinosaur. Add eyes with paper or use googly eyes.

Materials: paper towels, yarn, watered-down paints or food colouring

Instructions:

Make a ball out of the paper towel and wrap yarn around it. Dip the paper towels in watered down paint or food colouring. Unravel the yarn and lay the paper towel out to dry.

Cuisine/Cooking

Momies bananes/Yummy Mummy Bananas

Ingredients: 2-3 bananes, white chocolate, candy eyes, large Ziploc Bag



Instructions:

Melt the white chocolate in the microwave and put into a plastic bag. Cut end off the plastic bag. Then slice your bananas in half, place them on a plate, and squeeze the melted chocolate over creating your mummy design. While chocolate is still warm place in your candy eyes.

Épées de brtzel/Pretzel Swords

Ingredients: long pretzels, candy in shape of a ring, melted chocolate

Instructions:

Dip the pretzel into the melted chocolate and add a ring candy as the handle.



Science/Science

Cultivez un arc-en-ciel/Create a Rainbow



Materials: paper towel, washable markers, water, 2 small glasses

Instructions:

Fold over a piece of paper towel (so you have 2 pieces on top of each other). Trim the length to be 7.5 inches (any longer and the rainbow may not connect fully). Draw rectangles of the rainbow colors on each end. You want to make sure to fill these colors in well so there is enough dye to travel across the paper towel. Place 2 cups with water filled 3/4 full. You only want the bottom of the paper towel in so leave some space from the top of the cup. Then place the paper towel into the cups, with one end in each cup. The washable marker dye will slowly make its way up with the water to meet the other side in the center of the paper towel.

Lampe à lave dans une bouteille

Materials: an empty bottle, vegetable oil, water, food colouring, alka-seltzer tablets

Instructions:



First, fill the empty water bottle about 2/3 full with vegetable oil. Fill the rest with water, leaving a little of space at the top. Now, add the food coloring. The food coloring will only mix with the water, not the oil. We stirred our concoction with a chop stick to mix the food coloring well with the water. When you are ready for the fun, break an Alka-seltzer tablet into four pieces. Have your child drop in one piece at a time.

Jeux/Games

Duel de cheval, chapeau et cow-boy/Horse, Hat and Cowboy Duel

Equipment: two objects to signify « boots », « horses » and « hats »

Instructions:

Players shout "One, Two, Three, Shoot!" then must immediately place one of their items/toys on the table.

- Horse beats Hat because the horse tramples the hat
- Hat beats Cowboy because it goes on his head
- Cowboy beats Horse because he rides the horse

The player whose item/toy beats out his opponent's item/toy is the winner of the round.

You can play best two out of three rounds. For larger groups, split guests into two teams and have each team line up behind the current player. Each round is played by the next person in line. If they win, they go back to the end of their team's line. If they lose, they sit out of the rest of the game and cheer on their team.

Oeuf de dinosaure chaud/Hot Dinosaur Egg

Equipment: something to use as a dinosaur egg

Instructions:

Same rules as hot potato. When the music stops, whoever is holding the « egg » must do a silly move in order to play again.

Pictionary

Equipment: a paper and pencil

Instructions:

Name different things (i.e., cowboy, dinosaur, peace sign) that have to do with the time travel theme and give the kids 30 seconds to draw them the best that they can.

Construire un pyramide/Build a Pyramid

Equipment: paper cups

Instructions:

Everyone has one minute (or more time) to create a pyramid.

Variation: Can use cards for a challenge.

Emballer comme un momie/Mummy Wrap

Materials: toilet paper

Instructions:

Have teams wrap a person up as a mummy as best as they can in two minutes.
