

Concours d'art oratoire 2002!

Another successful year of Concours has been completed. Concours d'art oratoire is a French second language public speaking competition for children and youth held around the province and across the country. Students enter first in their schools. Students in grades 4-12 who place first or second in their school can then go on to compete in their school divisions. Winners at the divisional level participate in the provincial competition. This year Canadian Parents for French - Saskatchewan held regional finals for grades 4-8 in Yorkton and Prince Albert on April 13. Grades 9-12 competed in a provincial final in Saskatoon on May 4. More than 3000 students participated at the school level, and countless parents, teachers, administrators and chapter members across Saskatchewan helped prepare for this year's events.

In order to make these events even more exciting for the participants, our local organizers worked hard to obtain sponsorships from businesses and to invite local dignitaries to present the prizes. We were particularly pleased that the Honourable Clay Serby, Deputy Premier of Saskatchewan and MLA for Yorkton was able to make award presentations to many of the students who competed in the Southern Provincial

New for this year was the participation of Core French students in the competition. School Divisions which offer both French Immersion and Core programs were selected to participate on a trial basis. There were a number of schools that held local competitions and included Core French students. We anticipate expanding the Core competition next year to include school divisions from across Saskatchewan. We hope this will help to increase the visibility of this event so that more students will participate

at the High School Level. The cash prizes awarded to first and second place finishers in Grades 9-12 are intended to attract these student. The prospect of a trip to Toronto to participate in a National final will be an added incentive next year.

French for the Future

Its Impressive!! A technology that can bring together students from across the country to share ideas and concerns.

That was what happened for an hour and forty-five minutes during the French for the Future conference on April 16. Some seventy-five grade 11 and 12 students from all of the French immersion schools in Saskatoon as well as the francophone minority school, L'école canadienne, had the opportunity to see and talk to students in similar programs in St. John's, Fredricton, Halifax, Toronto, Winnipeg, Calgary Whitehorse and Vancouver. Big screen format and satellite technology made the distances between the sites disappear.

For the rest of the day, the students participated in workshops on "Language and Communication", "Justice and Politics", "French in Business" and "Education and Professional Development". Presenters for these events included adults from both the Francophone and Francophile communities in Saskatoon.
